Quiltrick #73: Since I'm working on a cutwork project, one great tool for cutting away fabric with applique or buttonhole stitch are "duckbill" scissors. The flat edge really protects your stitching while allowing you to cut away the unwanted area. And, lucky me, I inherited a pair from my grandma! And, speaking of my grandma, see below.

I've been trying to finish some UFO's lately. Thanks to the encouragement from my BeeFF's (quilting Bee girls⁽¹⁾) I recently finished three! In searching my quilting room I came across a piece started by my grandmother, a linen tablecloth with buttonhole stitch and cut work. It's at least 75 years old!
